## D. ACTION AGENDA:

1. Workshop to discuss the use of ARP Funds. Darin Wolf discussed using the America Relief Plan money for road maintenance or to pay off County equipment. Randy Jackson reported that Jack County has two padded jail cells and is discuss an interlocal agreement. Jackson stated that this could alleviate having to add a padded cell at this time. Jack Curd reported that the Sherriff's Department has two mental health inmates at this time. Curd also discussed that an interlocal agreement was up to the discretion of the Jack County Sheriff if he would allow inmates. If Jack County's cell was already in use, then Archer would have nowhere to go.

Wade Scarbrough stated that in his opinion the remodeling of the old jail is a want not a need. Scarbrough discussed redoing Decker Rd for \$260,000.00. Scarbrough stated that he could use \$150,000.00 of the ARP funds to go along with his road funds to complete the Decker Rd project. Pat Martin, III discussed setting up a criterion to decided which roads needed to be improved first. Martin acknowledged the padded cell is needed but not as much as redoing roads.

Todd Herring discussed projects that he needed to address for Precinct 4; paying off equipment and to add funds to Precinct 5 for road projects.

2. Consider and/or take action on letter requesting Attorney General's Opinion concerning the Archer County Sheriff's Commissary Funds. David Levy discussed the process of requesting an Attorney General Opinion. Jack Curd reported that he approved of the request.
