A. CALL TO ORDER

Greeting, Roll Call, and Determination of Quorum

ORDER TO APPROVE REPORTS

3. Approve line-item transfers. **Removed**

5. Approve Publisher's Certificates. **Removed**
6. Information on Software Package presented by Sam Goldsmith. **Sam Goldsmith with Goldsmith Solutions gave a presentation on the IT services Goldsmith Solutions would bring to Archer County. Jack Curd asked several questions pertaining to IT for the Sheriff's Office. Darin Wolf stated that the Elected Officials needed to meet with Mr. Goldsmith as a group to see if it would benefit the County to contract with an outside IT company. No action taken.**
7. Discuss and/or take action on Emergency Service Center. **Randy Jackson discussed that Metal Mart had drawn up preliminary plans for the Emergency Service Center, outside of building and overhangs equipment storage. Judge Jackson stated that he had talked to an architect about drawing up preliminary plans at a cost of between \$2,000.00 and \$3,000.00, for the interior for offices, restrooms and meeting room of the Emergency Service Center. Judge Jackson stated with the preliminary plans the Court would have a plan to go out for bids to build the Emergency Service Center.**

8. ORDER TO AUTHORIZED PRELIMINARY PLANS

The motion was made by Wade Scarbrough and seconded by Darin Wolf to approve having preliminary plans drawn up for the Emergency Service Center in the amount not to exceed \$3,000.00. Voting Yes 1-2-3-4-Judge

9. Discuss and/or take action on proposed site for the Archer Family Clinic. **Randy Jackson reported on his original conversation with Mike Huff, Hamilton Hospital CEO, about building a new clinic east of the Courthouse, where the old Sheriff's Office was located. Mr. Huff stated he didn't care if Archer County owned the building or if Hamilton Hospital owned it. Mr. Huff came and met with Randy Jackson and Shane Wright. He stated that there would be adequate space for the new clinic at this location. The new Hamilton Hospital Building had just opened and the cost of the project was more than they had anticipated. Randy Jackson stated that Mr. Huff was reluctant to build a new clinic and asked if the County would build it. Mr. Huff also asked if the County would share the cost on preliminary plans for a new clinic. Judge Jackson stated the clinic would have to be ADA compliant as well as medical compliant.**

ORDER TO APPROVE COST OF PRELIMINARY PLANS

The motion was made by Todd Herring and seconded by Kendall Coleman to approve sharing the cost of preliminary plans with Olney Hamilton Hospital for the Archer Family Clinic not to exceed \$3,000.00. Voting Yes 1-2-3-4-Judge

10. Discuss and/or take action on Subdivision Regulations. **Wade Scarbrough discussed mobile home parks and man camps. Mr. Scarbrough wants to keep the Court aware of the possibility of these when the Court discusses the Subdivision Regulations.**

11. Consider and/or approve a Resolution giving Sheriff Curd authorization to enter into a Multi-Use Agreement with TXDOT concerning Flock Cameras. **Jack Curd discussed the Resolution that was needed with TXDOT for the Flock Cameras. Sheriff Curd reported that his office uses the Flock cameras in Wichita County and in Lakeside City. Sheriff Curd stated that there would be a Flock camera placed on Hwy 281 South of Windthorst and Hwy 79 by Lakeside City.**

ORDER TO APPROVE RESOLUTION

The motion was made by Todd Herring and seconded by Kendall Coleman to approve Multi-Use Agreement with TXDOT concerning Flock Cameras. Voting Yes 1-2-3-4-Judge
