8. Discuss and/or take action on resolution expressing no confidence in Constable Precinct 4. **Randy Jackson reminded the Court this was not a petition for removal. Darin Wolf asked Jordyn Berend if this was the route the Court needed to be taking at this time. Jordyn Berend stated that she could not state whether the Court should or shouldn't vote for the resolution. It should be based on the evidence the Court had presented to them. Ms. Berend stated that the Commissioner Court has no authority to remove an Elected Official from their elected position. If the County feels it needs to**

take some kind of action, this is the only kind of action the County can take. Mr. Wolf asked what kind of evidence was shown. Judge Jackson stated civil case 2023-0084A-CV that was filed in the 97th District Court. Judge Jackson reminded the Court that this was a resolution of the Commissioners Court of Archer County expressing no confidence in Elected Official Precinct 4 and requesting resignation.

ORDER TO APPROVE RESOLUTION

The motion was made by Kendall Coleman and seconded by Wade Scarbrough to approve resolution in expressing no confidence in Constable, Precinct 4. Voting Yes 1-2-3-4-Judge

9. Consider and/or approve external audit for the year ended September 30, 2025 as presented by Edgin, Parkman, Fleming and Fleming, PC. **Joshua Harman with Edgin, Parkman, Fleming and Fleming, PC discussed the outside audit.**

ORDER TO APPROVE AUDIT

10. Consider and/or approve a Joint Election Resolution between the City of Scotland, Texas and the Archer County Elections Administrator. **Christie Mooney discussed the Joint Election Resolution.**

11. Consider and/or approve resolution for State Sheriffs Grant. **Randy Jackson stated that this resolution was supporting SB 8. Jack Curd reported that now all Sheriffs in the State of Texas must participate in the 287(g) program. The resolution is a requirement for the grant.**

The motion was made by Kendall Coleman and seconded by Todd Herring to approve resolution for State Sheriffs Grant. Voting Yes 1-2-3-4-Judge

12. Consider and/or approve Over Axle and Over Gross Weight Tolerance Permit Bond. **Darin Wolf explained the requirement of an Over Axle and Over Gross Weight Tolerance Permit Bond. Commissioner Wolf stated that the bond would cover all four precincts; each commissioner would need to complete the required paperwork for the permits.**

ORDER TO APPROVE PERMIT BOND

The motion was made by Darin Wolf and seconded by Kendall Coleman to approve Over Axle and Over Gross Weight Tolerance Permit Bond in the amount of \$15,000.00. Voting Yes 1-2-3-4-Judge

13. Discuss and/or take action on Over Axle and Over Gross Weight Tolerance Permit Application.

ORDER TO APPROVE PERMIT APPLICATION

The motion was made by Darin Wolf and seconded by Kendall Coleman to move forward with completing the Over Axle and Over Gross Weight Tolerance Permit Application. Voting Yes 1-2-3-4-Judge

14. Discuss and/or take action on improvements and/or additions to the Archer County Junior Livestock barn. Presented by Jason Austin. **Jason Austin with the Archer County Junior Livestock Show reported that the Livestock Show paid \$650,000.00 this past show in January, 2026. Mr. Austin advised the Court on the Show Boards plan for barn expansion. The plan is to build a 50' X100' cattle facility on the South side of the current barn. The end goal would be to revamp the old cattle facility for sheep and goats, and then to revamp the east side for rabbits, chickens and turkeys. Mr. Austin stated that the new expansion on the South side of the barn would only have a roof on it so the county could utilize the building year-round to store equipment. The board has applied for a Bingo Kinder grant and was awarded it in the amount of \$10,000.00. They have an idea to have a drawdown for a side-by-side vehicle and selling tickets at the rodeo, Windthorst Celebration and other events hoping to make \$10,000.00 on the fund raiser. Ok Concrete has already given \$10,000.00 to the board for the improvements. Between these three items the Board hopes to have \$30,000.00 to go toward the barn expansion. Randy Jackson and Darin Wolf stated that they have seen the program grow over the last ten years.**

ORDER TO APPROVE

The motion was made by Randy Jackson and seconded by Darin Wolf to approve the site for the expansion of a 50' X 100' addition to the Archer County Junior Livestock barn. Voting Yes 1-2-3-4-Judge

15. Discuss and/or take action on Subdivision Regulations. **Wade Scarbrough discussed the proposed final subdivision regulations. Mr. Scarbrough reported that the only change needed would be to make all culvert 30' for commercial and residential.**

ORDER TO SET PUBLIC HEARING

The motion was made by Wade Scarbrough and seconded by Todd Herring to set a public hearing for the Subdivision Regulations with the change of culverts to be 30'. Voting Yes 1-2-3-4-Judge

16. Discuss and/or take action on installing Stop signs at Culley Road and Parker Road. **Wade Scarbrough reported that he had received several calls about the safety of the intersection of Culley Rd and Parker Rd. Mr. Scarbrough reported that Parker Rd T-bones into Culley Rd. and he would recommend to make the intersection a three way stop.**

ORDER TO SET PUBLIC HEARING

The motion was made by Wade Scarbrough and seconded by Darin Wolf to set a public hearing to install stop signs on Parker Road to make the intersection a three way stop. Voting Yes 1-2-3-4-Judge

17. Discuss and/or take action on Economic Development and Project Raptor. **Randy Jackson discussed the Raptor project. Randy Jackson stated that he had been contacted from Project Raptor to meet in Executive Session today and then they later cancelled. Project Raptor is the data center in the North end of the County. Judge Jackson did ask them to make a public statement that the Court could share with the community around Three Way Road. He has not heard back from them at this time, he doesn't know if they will be at the next commissioner court meeting or not. They are still making decisions on moving forward with this project. No action taken.**

18. Adjourn into Executive Session. **No action taken.**

Having no further business to consider, the Court adjourned at 10:38 A.M.
