ORDER TO APPROVE MINUTES

The motion was made by Todd Herring and seconded by Kendall Coleman to approve minutes from May, 2026. Voting Yes 1-3-4-Judge

- 7. Discuss and/or take action on a structure for Regional Incinerator. **Jack Curd discussed having a Regional Incinerator. Nortex Regional Planning Commission is going to gift Archer County a Regional Incinerator. Sheriff Curd discussed needing a 16’ X 16’ cement slab for the Incinerator to be placed on and a structure for the Incinerator to keep it out of the weather.**

ORDER TO APPROVE FUNDS

The motion was made by Todd Herring and seconded by Kendall Coleman to approve using funds from #411 Law Enforcement Repairs and Maintenance for a 16’ X 16’ cement slab for the Regional Incinerator to be placed on and to construct a three-sided structure to house the Regional Incinerator if there are funds available in #411. Voting Yes 1-3-4-Judge

- 8. Discuss and/or take action on Skid Steer for Precinct 3. **Randy Jackson discussed that the Skid Steer is \$98,000.00, but the interest made it exceed \$100,000.00.**

ORDER TO LEASE SKID STEER

The motion was made by Todd Herring and seconded by Wade Scarbrough to enter into a lease agreement with American National Leasing for five years for Precinct 3. Voting Yes 1-3-4-Judge

- 9. Discuss, Consider and/or take action on Deputy overtime pay in reference to the 287G program. **Jack Curd discussed the 287G program. Jack Curd reported that anytime a deputy is on patrol and stops a vehicle that pertains to 287G, Curd can submit the hours to ICE Operation. The Federal Government will reimburse the County for the salary and benefits of the Deputy or Deputies for every hour that is completed doing ICE Operations. The Federal Government will also pay for any overtime pay, salary and benefits for a deputy who wants to work overtime doing just ICE Operations. The Federal Government will also pay up to \$15,000.00 a year for IT, computer and equipment per deputy for ICE Operations; and a one-time \$100,000.00 for a vehicle for being a part of the 287G Program. Jack Curd will have to submit monthly reports for the reimbursements. Sheriff**

Curd stated that he will also be reimbursed for his time on ICE Operations excluding overtime pay. Sheriff Curd asked the Court that since deputies are on a comp time system, when his department does an ICE Operation to pay out the over time since the money will be reimbursed to the County. Sheriff Curd stated that the Federal Government will pay the same that the County pays the deputies including benefits. He is asking the Court to pay the deputies their ICE Operation over time. Jack Curd stated that he would like the money that comes back to the County from their regular time, he would like it to go into his overtime budget to pay the comp time that the Sheriff's Office has been doing. Sheriff Curd stated that every year the Court wants to clear out all the comp time his office has accumulated. This extra money would allow that to happen without hurting the budget. Cristi Kellar asked if the deputies could only receive 25% of the pay. Jack Curd stated that deputies are eligible to receive up to 25% of their yearly pay in overtime covered by the Federal Government. Jack Curd stated that he would use the formula that the Federal Government uses to determine how much the County would be reimbursed. EX: the deputy cost this much per hour; this is what his benefits cost per hour, medical per hour, HSA, worker's comp, longevity, cell phone allowance and certification pay. Sheriff Curd reported that he had already applied for the grant that would pay for the housing of an ICE inmate.

ORDER TO ALLOW DEPUTY OVERTIME PAY 287G PROGRAM

The motion was made by Wade Scarbrough and seconded by Kendall Coleman to allow Deputy overtime pay with the Federal reimbursement 287G program. Voting Yes 1-3-4-Judge

Having no further business to consider, the Court adjourned at 10:27 A.M.
